



2011 – 18/19 June New York

- Joint meeting UNESCO Chairs OER
- Agreed Plan of Action for Open Educational Resources
- Two main Lines of Action
 - Global OER Graduate School (priority PhD level) (coordinator OUNL)
 - OER Knowledge Cloud (coordinator AU)
- Two enabling Lines of Action
 - Global OER Map of national and institutional OER initiatives
 - Global balance in the network of UNESCO Chairs in OER





Rationale behind the Graduate School

- Need of substantial expansion of the OER research base, to:
 - develop and explore new knowledge in the broad OER field linked to a variety of disciplines
 - provide a solid fundament for the introduction and implementation of OER innovations
 - monitor and evaluate the outcomes of institutional, national and international OER initiatives
 - increase evidence and guidance for OER in practice
- in an international contextual diversity

 - For 3 GO-GN seminars: US\$153K



- 10 years GO-GN: counted from here
- Cape Town
- Simultaneously with kick-off of ROER4D
- According to Fred (in report for Ministry of Education, Culture & Science):

"Participants were unanimously very enthusiastic about the output of the Seminar in terms of relevant feedback on their research (plans), the creation of a fruitful network of kindred spirits, and the extensive informal contacts."












2015: hand-over to OU-UK

- Retirement Fred Mulder in November 2014
- No follow-up in OUNL to take over GO-GN
- Banff seminar was co-organized with OU-UK
- In July 2015 final hand-over
- From announcement letter of Fred :

"It has been a great pleasure and privilege to serve GO-GN and its members as its founding Academic Coordinator. However, I have formally retired as a full Professor at OUNL by the end of October 2014 and that was paralleled with the end of my four-year term as UNESCO Chair holder in OER at OUNL. In order to find a new home for GO-GN, I contacted our colleagues at the OU in the UK (OU UK). We were quick in our decision to link GO-GN to their OER Research Hub since the synergy and mutual benefits were crystal clear. "

- To "open practice" and value-driven approach (open pedagogy, social justice perspective,...)




Topics and rationale

- How are the topics mentioned in the Rationale (slide 10) linked to the topics from the PhD studies?
 - Most PhD studies address more than one of the topics

Rationale	Topics
Develop and explore new knowledge in the broad OER field linked to a variety of disciplines	E.g. the MOOC studies
Provide a solid fundament for the introduction and implementation of OER innovations	Most PhD-studies address this (e.g. Bernardo Tabuenca, Jos Rikers)
Monitor and evaluate the outcomes of institutional, national and international OER initiatives	E.g. studies of Igor Lesko and Glenda Cox
Increase evidence and guidance for OER in practice	Has overlap with all previous topics







Future

- The rationale behind GO-GN is still valid
- Steady growth needed
- Complementing and strengthening by regional RO-GNs (regional chapters)
 - Fred mentioned the idea of an EO-GN (European) in 2011
 - Opportunity for joining forces in regionspecific topics
- Regional chapters under supervision of an UNESCO Chair in the region
